Outwater's Militia



Outwater's Militia was created in 1979 and modeled after Captain John Outwater's Company of Bergen County Militia. Since that time, the recreated unit has spent considerable time in researching how these men appeared, their lives and culture. The unit has been at hundreds of Revolutionary War re-enactments, up and down the east coast, over the years and prides itself with this experience and accurate portrayal of the common solider of the American Revolution. Outwater's has the reputation of being one of the premier militia units in the hobby. It has much to offer in its School of Militia program.



What you will learn at the School of the Militia

Participants will learn about the new requirement trends for attending many 250th anniversary re-enactments. Violate these, and you may be asked to leave! There will also be a presentation of how the militia should be used at re-enactments to accurately portray the true role of these men. Guest speaker, Julie Power, an expert in 18th century food and farming, will instruct on the type of food militia were likely to have and the need to farm during their service. Shop licenses will be examined to identify common, everyday items held by the common man of the time. Finally, there will be a discussion of the realities of life in the 18th century and how they impacted the world view of the average 18th century citizen (What were they *thinking*!)---- and much more!
